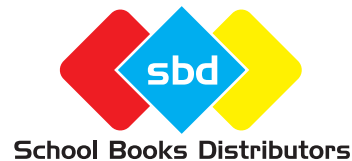

Sometimes Gasarabwe would be reading books. Whenever he would see a boat in a book while reading, he would close the book and stop reading.



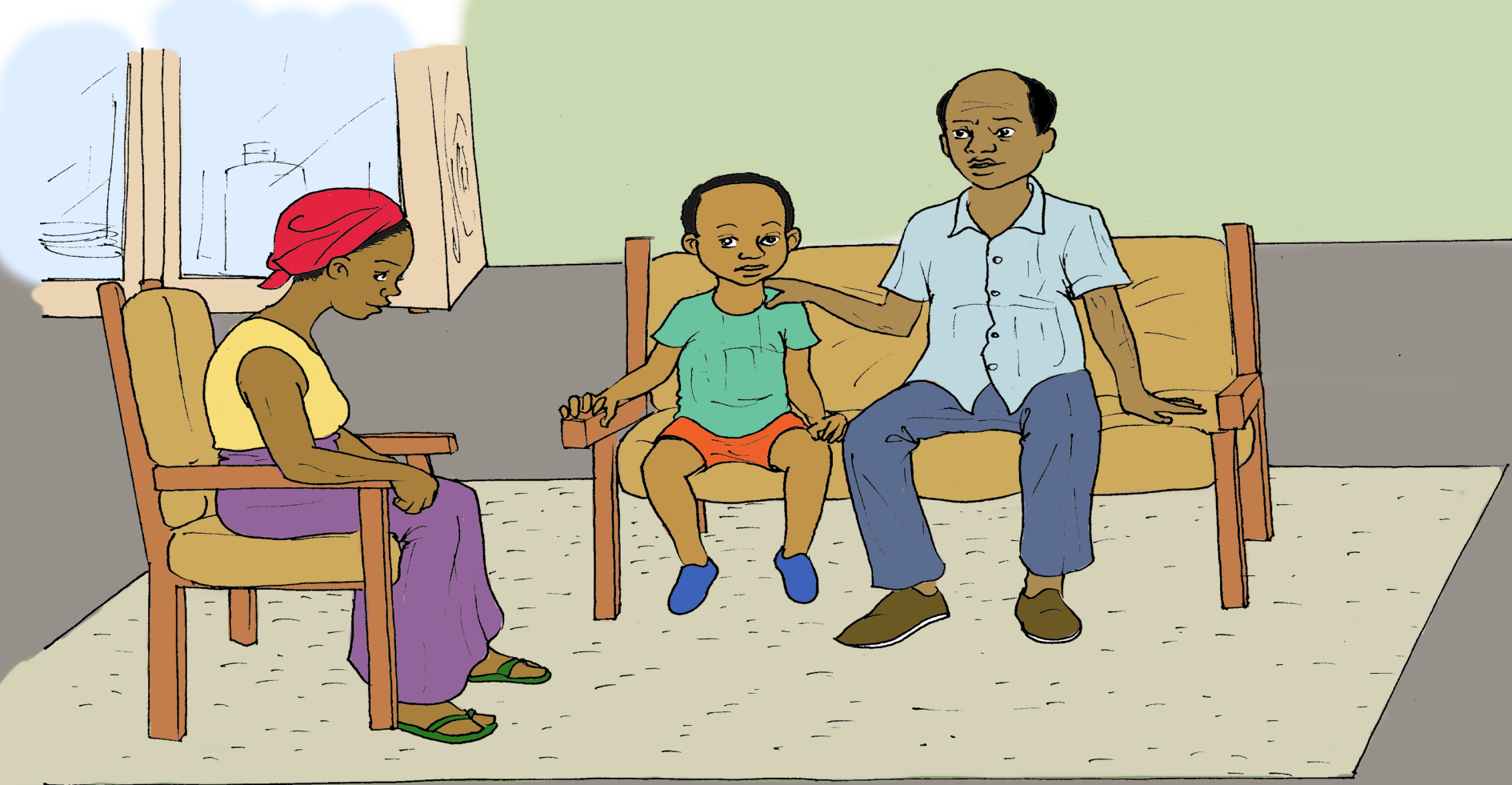
Sometimes Gasarabwe would be watching television. Whenever a boat was shown, he would shut his eyes.
